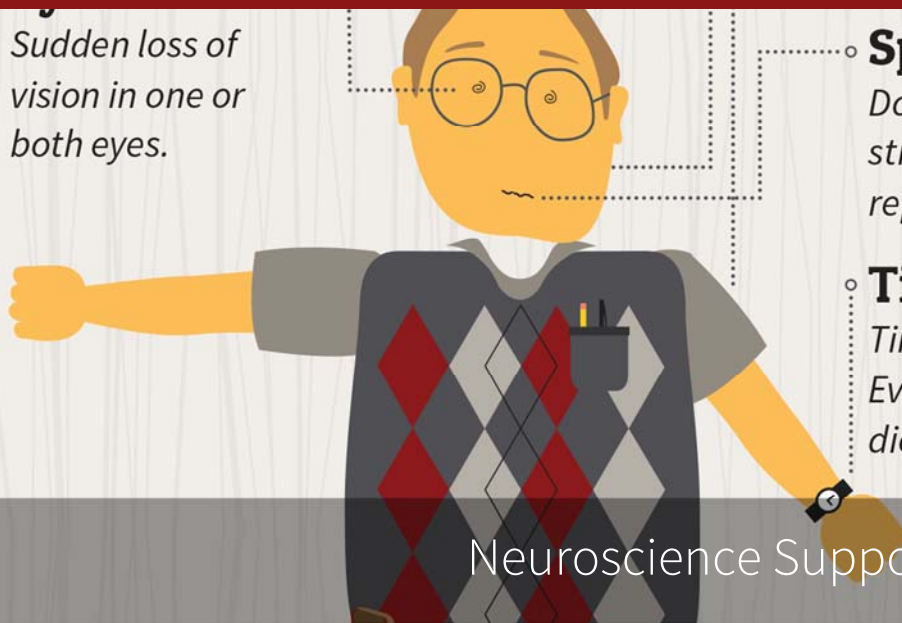


Stanford Speech Communication Group
