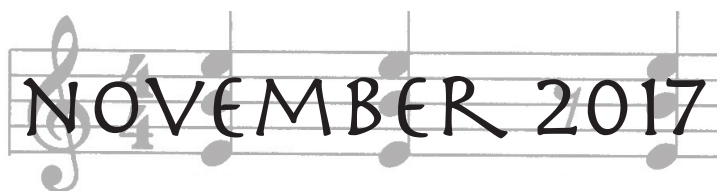

LE JAZZ HOT QUARTET — Gypsy Jazz

Le Jazz Hot Quartet is an ensemble of accomplished and versatile musicians celebrating the music of Django Reinhardt and Stephane Grappelli. Hearing the ensemble live carries the listener back to the 1930's and to the small, smoky jazz clubs of Paris or the refined lounges of the famous Hotel Ritz. Critics have hailed the group's playing as "intricate, scorching and often brilliant."
